Last week's trivia answer: Scholars believe the horns on Moses were due to a mistranslation of Hebrew scriptures into Latin by St. Jerome. In scripture, Moses is described as having "rays on the skin of his face," and Jerome translated "rays" as "horns" based on the Hebrew word, keren, which can mean either "radiated" or "to grow horns."
